## Parks & **Facilities**


Your Parks System: Rare and spectacular wildlife, scenic trails, ecologically pristine preserves, recreational facilities and abundant leisure opportunities; all within minutes of your home

#### **B** Hart Community Center

Available for private, community group or business rentals. Amenities include: kitchen, tables, chairs, and air conditioning. The hall holds a maximum of one hundred (100) people. Reservations are accepted on a first come, first served basis only. A security deposit, completed rental agreement and rental fee are required for reservation.

#### **Shultz Park**

Eighteen and a half (18.5) acres located on the corner of Dilley and Davisburg Roads. Park includes a swing set, ball diamonds, restrooms and an outdoor pavilion with picnic tables and grills. The pavilion is available for use on a first come, first served basis or by reservation. A security deposit, completed rental agreement and rental fee are required for reservation. Shultz Park closes October 15 and reopens April 15 (weather permitting).



#### A Mill Pond Park

Five and a half (5.5) acres located on Davisburg Road in downtown Davisburg. Park includes outdoor tennis, basketball, sand volleyball, shuffleboard courts, horseshoe pits, accessible fishing pier, playground area, gazebo, park benches, restrooms, and an outdoor pavilion with picnic tables and grills. The pavilion is available for use on a first come, first served basis or by reservation. A security deposit, completed rental agreement and rental fee are required for reservation.



#### D Shiawassee Basin Preserve

Five hundred and fourteen (514) acres located west of downtown Davisburg. Park entrances are located off of both Eaton and Davisburg Roads. Nature trails are located at both the Eaton Road and Davisburg Road entrances. Horses, mountain bikes and other high impact activities are not permitted in the Preserve. An outdoor pavilion with picnic tables and grills, restrooms, ponds for fishing, ball diamonds, and the Springfield Township Civic Center are all accessible from the Davisburg Road entrance. The pavilion is available for use on a first come, first served basis or by reservation. A security deposit, completed rental agreement and rental fee are required for reservation. This preserve is home to many wildlife species including White-Tail Deer, Eastern Massasauga Rattlesnake, Coyotes, Poweshiek Skipperling, among many others.

#### **FACILITY RENTALS**

The following facilities are available for private, community group, or business rentals use. For additional information, please contact the Springfield Township Parks and Recreation office at 248-846-6558.

#### HART COMMUNITY CENTER

Amenities include: kitchen, tables, chairs, capacity for one hundred (100) people and air conditioning. Private and business rental fee includes seven (7) hours of facility time. Non-Profit group rental fee includes five (5) hours of facility time. Additional hours may be purchased, if more time is needed. Alcoholic beverages are allowed with required insurance only. Reservations are accepted on a first come, first served basis. A completed rental agreement, security deposit and rental fee are required for all reservations. To receive the non-profit rental rate, your group must provide proof of such status (501-C3).

#### **PARK PAVILIONS**

Springfield Township Parks and Recreation has three (3) park pavilions available for use at Mill Pond Park, Shiawassee Basin Preserve and Shultz Park. All pavilions include picnic tables and grills. Restroom facilities are available at all pavilion locations (weather permitting). Rental fee includes use of the facility from 8am until the time the park closes. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed at the Mill Pond Park pavilion. Alcoholic beverages are allowed at the Shiawassee Basin Preserve and Shultz Park pavilions by permit only with the necessary insurance. Pavilions may be reserved in advance or may be used on a first come, first served basis (if available). Reservations are strongly encouraged! A completed rental agreement, security deposit and rental fee are required for all reservations. To receive the non-profit rental rate, your group must provide proof of such status (501-C3).

**Certain restrictions exist for all of our properties.** See page 34 for a list of park rules.

#### E Green Lake Park

One and a half (1.5) acres located on the corner of Northbay and Foster Roads. Park includes playground area, picnic tables, and outdoor basketball court.

#### **Davis Lake Overlook**

Thirty-six and a half (36.5) acres adjoins the Shiawassee Basin Preserve west of Eaton Road, north of downtown Davisburg. The property was acquired under the terms of a grant, along with the conservation easement placed on the property, activities detrimental to the Conservation Values of this site are expressly prohibited. See Park Rules on page 34.



#### G River Run Preserve

Seventy-one and a half (71.5) acres located between Andersonville and Clark roads. This is the newest park in our system and was acquired in January of 2011. This property includes a quality natural resource ecosystem along the headwaters of the Shiawassee River. The purchase of the property was made possible through a donation to Springfield Township from an endowment fund. The park's trail at the Andersonville Road entrance is in progress so please use caution when visiting.

For medical appointments, call for a ride when appointment is made. Please call at least two days in advance to allow for scheduling for all other rides. If you need the handicap accessible van please specify at the time of your call.

First pick-up is 8:30am and last pick-up is 4pm.

#### WHAT MEDICAL CENTERS **ARE INCLUDED?**

Doctors' Hospital of Michigan (formerly North Oakland) Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital Pontiac St. Joseph's Hospital New Clarkston Medical Building and **Great Lakes Cancer Center** 

#### **PROCEDURES**

- 1. A potential rider must fill out a medical form before using this
- 2. A \$3 donation is requested for each one way trip (\$6 round trip). \$5 each way for hospital trips.
- 3. Drivers cannot alter the schedule. Riders must be ready 15 minutes in advance and waiting at the door.
- 4. Drivers cannot transport medical emergencies (call 911), nor can they pick-up or deliver medications.
- 5. Drivers cannot enter private residences or assist clients in getting ready. Assistance with packages on the return will be given to the front door only.
- 6. Drivers cannot bring people in wheelchairs over door sills, down stairs or across grass or gravel. Please make sure wheelchair riders are accessible or make sure someone is home to assist them to the van.
- 7. Drivers cannot lift the passengers, so please do not ask them to do so.
- Riders' driveways must be salted and plowed in inclement weather.
- 9. Rider with cognitive impairments may be advised to have a caregiver accompany them.

Take a boat ride to your own private island campground for a fun filled day of activities. Each morning your child is transported to a real island on Pontiac Lake surrounded by woods, trails and water. It's

an adventure camp like no other! Skull Island Camp is in its 12th year of operation. The camp is not designed to be the biggest in terms of accommodating numbers of campers, but definitely strives to be the best. Our hours of operation are very flexible for all types of working parents. Our normal hours of operation are 9am to 5pm with an option of many pick up and drop off times. #### **State Licensed Camp**

We are a state licensed camp. While our size has grown throughout the years our specialized way of child care has not. 

## 2018 Election News

Two elections will be held in 2018—the State Primary Election on Tuesday, August 7 and the State General Election on Tuesday, November 6. Springfield voters will have their first chance to use new election equipment and many will have a new polling location beginning this election year. See details at right!

#### **New Polling Locations**

Two Clarkston Schools elementary buildings and one Oakland Schools Technical Campus have served as Springfield Township precincts for many years. The arrangement worked very well and we are grateful to administration and staff for accommodating our residents. However, hosting a precinct means losing a cafeteria or classroom for the day and the schools also have expressed safety concerns because there's no way to control who is in and out of the buildings on Election Day. For these reasons, we're relocating polling locations out of school buildings. Voters in Precincts 4, 5 and 6 were sent updated Voter ID cards listing their new polling locations at either Dixie Baptist Church or Waypoint Church. Precinct 3 will have a new home at Fire Station 3 which is under construction and will be completed before the August primary. Voters in Precinct 3 will receive their new ID cards this spring. This new rating goes into effect May 1 and, upon renewal, most residents could see insurance premiums drop\* approx. 20% and some as much as 30%!



#### **New Equipment**

Michigan's election equipment was 10 years old and nearing the end of its life. Following many years of focus groups and investigation, the state selected new equipment. All jurisdictions in Oakland County have brand new tabulators and accessible devices from Hart Intercivic. These voting systems are the newest digital scanning technology and have gone through extensive testing at the federal and state levels. Like the previous machines, the new equipment is not connected to the internet plus it provides additional security all through the voting and reporting process. We're confident that voters and election inspectors alike will appreciate the simple design and large screen which make this new equipment intuitive and user-friendly.

## Natural Resources Updates

Over the past three years, our Natural Resources
Program staff have been working to improve the
lands and waters of Springfield Township. These
efforts have led to a decrease in invasive plant
species at many sites in the township and significant
wildlife habitat improvements at our Township parks.

Join us this year for several staff-hosted events to explore new or seldom seen portions of our township-owned preserves that highlight the natural beauty of the township and wildlife habitat we protect.

#### **Exploring River Run Preserve**

#### June 2, 10am-12pm

The River Run Preserve is the most recent addition to the Township's park network and is now open for exploration. Recent improvements include a trail network for people and habitat management for plants and wildlife. Join us for a guided hike through the preserve where we can expect to observe early season wildflowers including trilliums and orchids. This field tour is rated as low difficulty due to anticipated length of hiking loop (1 mile), varying terrain and potentially uneven footing in the prairie fen.



## **Hazardous Waste**Collection

Springfield Township has joined with other communities in Oakland County to provide our residents with a safe and easy way to rid their homes of hazardous waste.

#### **Exploring the Shiawassee Basin Preserve**

#### July 29, 10am-12pm; August 25, 10am-12pm

Tour the wilder part of the Shiawassee Basin Preserve with Natural Resources Manager Mike Losey to learn about rare plants, wildlife, unique habitats and the steps Springfield Township is taking to preserve them. Participants should bring sturdy hiking boots, preferably waterproof, with sufficient ankle protection and support to guard against cut stumps and uneven terrain. Also, insect repellant clothing or spray, sunscreen and a water bottle are advised. This field tour is rated as low-medium difficulty due to anticipated length of hiking loop (1.5 miles), varying terrain and potentially uneven footing in the prairie fen. Meet at the North Shiawassee Trail Head on the west side of Eaton Rd, about halfway between Rattalee Lake Rd and Davisburg Rd.

#### Heritage Hike

#### **September 22, 9–11am**

Join us on the morning of the Davisburg Heritage Festival for an invigorating hike through the Davis Lake Overlook property, exploring the woods and wetlands using our convenient trail network. The short hike (3/4 mile) is suitable for the whole family but keep in mind these are rustic, unpaved trails so expect some hills and uneven ground. The hike will conclude prior to other Heritage Festival activities. Meet at the Davis Lake Overlook Trail Head on the west side of Eaton Rd, about ½ mile north of Davisburg Rd.







## **Park** Rules

#### **PARK RULES**

- 1. Park Hours—Summer Hours: April 15—Labor Day 8am—10pm: Fall/Winter Hours: Labor Day—April 14, 8am-8pm
- 2. Open fires are prohibited.
- 3. Glass containers are prohibited.
- 4. No littering or dumping allowed.
- 5. Park in designated areas only.
- 6. ORV's, ATV's, snowmobiles and motorcycles are prohibited.
- 7. Lawful hunting and trapping are permitted in designated areas only. Trap and skeet shooting are
- 8. Damaging or removing park property is prohibited.
- 9. Business of a commercial nature is allowed by permission only.
- 10. Loud music; profanity; or loud, abusive, and/or disorderly conduct is prohibited.
- 11. Alcohol consumption is prohibited.
- 12. Swimming is prohibited except in designated areas. \*This list is not inclusive. Please visit the park office for a complete list of rules for each park. The Shiawassee Basin Preserve properties have additional rules, which can be found at the Springfield Township Parks and Recreation office. Please report all violators of park rules to the Oakland County Sheriff at 248-858-4950. Violation of park rules is a civil infraction and may lead to court action. A \$250 reward to anyone who leads to the conviction of a park vandal.
- \*\*All park restrooms open April 15 & close October 15 (weather permitting).

#### **PARKS & PETS**

- Do not leave pets unattended (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.4).
- Pets must be on a six (6) foot leash and in your possession, except when hunting (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.2).
- Pets may not run loose nor create a disturbance to others (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.5).
- Pets not in possession/under immediate control of the owner may be removed from the park (Ord. 42)
- Pets causing a nuisance or disturbance may be removed from the park or recreation area (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.6).
- Pets are not allowed in or near any beach area or water area used for swimming (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.3).
- Pets are not allowed in any building or facility, with the exception of service dogs and during classes in which the pet is enrolled (Ord. 42 Sec. 8.4).
- Please be courteous and clean up after your pet!

#### DAVIS LAKE OVERLOOK

Thirty-six and a half (36.5) acres adjoins the Shiawassee Basin Preserve west of Eaton Road, north of downtown Davisburg. The property was acquired under the terms of a grant, along with the conservation easement placed on the property, activities detrimental to the Conservation Values of this site are expressly prohibited. These activities

- include, but are not limited to, the following:

  Motorized vehicles of any type (i.e. ATVs, motorcycles) and non-motorized vehicles (i.e. bikes).
- Gasoline or electric powered boats or personal watercraft.
- Horses and horseback riding.
- Hunting, trapping and skeet shooting, or possession of weapons of any nature.
- Removal, damage or destruction of plants, trees or wildlife.
- Camping or campfires.
- In addition, general Park Rules also apply.

#### SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP PARKS AND RECREATION REFUND POLICY

- No refunds will be given less than 5 business days prior to the start date of any program, camp or class, unless the program/camp/class was cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. All other cancellations/ refunds will be subject to a \$5 administration fee per person, per class, program, or camp.
- No refunds will be issued for special events or one day programs, unless cancelled by the Parks and Recreation Department.
- No refunds will be given for amusement park tickets.

All refunds will be refunded in the form of an Account Credit, Check or your VISA/MC/Discover will be credited. Items must be refunded in the way they were paid, unless you are requesting an Account Credit. No cash refunds will be given. Check refunds will be issued according to the Township bill-paying schedule, which may take 4-6 weeks. If the refund is less than \$10, a credit will be posted to your account. Account Credits will remain on the customer's account for **one year** from the date of the credit posting.

#### **CLASS REGISTRATION DEADLINES**

#### **TEAM/LEAGUE SPORTS**

After the registration deadline, absolutely no refunds or credits will be given. All patron requested transfers must be done prior to the registration deadline.

#### **TRANSFERS**

Transfers are only authorized providing space is available in the new activity. All transfers will only be completed once a transfer form has been submitted and any differences in fees have been paid.

#### **MEDICAL EMERGENCIES**

Patron requested refunds due to medical emergencies may be refunded at a pro-rated rate, upon request in writing. Patron must produce doctor's note. No administrative fees will apply.

#### **FACILITY RENTALS**

If the cancellation/transfer request by the applicant occurs more than fourteen days prior to the event: All transfers are subject to a \$10 administrative fee, pending the new date is available. All transfers must be done in person. In the case of a refund, the rental fee minus \$10 will be refunded along with the deposit. If rental fee has not been made, the \$10 fee will be deducted from the security deposit. If a cancelation by the applicant occurs less than fourteen days prior to the event: The entire rental fee is forfeited and the deposit will be returned in full, regardless of the reason for the cancellation, including inclement weather. Regular policies regarding return of security deposit still apply.
