- Cell phones

- Household items/furnishings, appliances, clothing, furniture
- Computers (for reuse) and disks
- Cell phones

Home Depot

- All household batteries
- Cell phone batteries
- Cordless power tool batteries
- Compact fluorescent light bulbs

Kroger

- Plastic grocery bags

Liberty Tax Service

- Cell phones (benefits U.S. soldiers)

Office Depot

- Cell phones
- Rechargeable batteries
- Ink jet and toner cartridges

Office Max

- All printer/toner cartridges except Epson

Radio Shack

- Rechargeable batteries
- Cell phones

Sprint/Nextel

- Cell phones (benefits education program)

Staples

- HP, Lexmark and Dell printer cartridges

Athletic Shoes

-Nike accepts any brand of old athletic shoes (no cleats/metal) for their Reuse-A-Shoe program. More than 20 million pairs of shoes have been processed and recycled into material for courts, athletic fields and playgrounds. -Used motor oil. FREE-5 gallon limit per week

-Used motor oil. FREE-5 gallon limit per week

-Paper retriever-large dumpster container in parking lot. Deposit newspaper, magazines, catalogs, etc.

Styrofoam Cups/trays

American Flags

-Can be turned into the Springfield Township Clerk's office for proper disposal.



GENERAL TIPS

- ☢ **LATEX paint: Allow it to dry and become solid (putting in kitty litter or sawdust can help), and dispose in garbage.**
- ☢ **Do not mix household hazardous waste together.**
- ☢ **Do not pour household hazardous waste down drains or storm drains.**
- ☢ **Do not dispose of household hazardous waste with the trash.**
- ☢ **Do not bury household hazardous waste.**
- ☢ **Do not pour on the ground.**
- ☢ **Store materials in a cool, dry place.**
