Old Business:

1. International Fire Code

Supervisor Trout noted for the audience the Board has been considering adopting an Ordinance based on the International Fire Code with certain provisions specific to the Township. Fire Chief Oaks has looked at several examples and determined the White Lake Township example most fits the Township's needs with a couple of caveats.

Attorney Need was fine with the changes from the Fire Chief and if the Board is satisfied, will incorporate those and bring it back for a first introduction at the July meeting. There were no objections.

New Business:

1. Oakland County Parks & Recreation Presentation

Michael Donnellon and Jim Dunleavy with Oakland County Parks updated the Board with DVD and PowerPoint presentations on County resources available to the community. Included in the

presentation were opportunities for partnerships, County wide comprehensive planning, and potential consolidation efforts. They also provided information on the parks and recreation millage renewal proposal of .2415 mils. Mr. Donnellon concluded by referring people to their website at www.oakgov.com/parksrec as an additional source of information.

Trustee Vallad commented they are only proposing a millage renewal, with the economic downturn, where are they planning to make budget adjustments and will the money be available if the Township wants to partake in any collaborative efforts?

Mr. Donnellon and Mr. Dunleavy responded they are in the process of forecasting out 10 years instead of 4 years and will be cutting back on some major maintenance projects such as parking lot repairs. They have had to cut back on staffing and are looking to increase their volunteer base. They also noted they cut expenses this year by growing their own flowers for planting and are looking at other creative ways to get things done.

Clerk Moreau noted at a prior meeting, the Township expressed that trail connectivity is important. Mr. Donnellon and Mr. Dunleavy said there are researching different grants to help with that funding.

Supervisor Trout thanked Mr. Donnellon and Mr. Dunleavy for their attendance and presentation.

2. Internship Program Approval

Supervisor Trout commented that because Oakland University has expressed interest, he is proposing establishing an unpaid Township internship program. He noted the program would not fit every department but it would be a benefit to others. He is proposing two terms, a summer term and a fall term at which time the program could be re-evaluated.

Trustee Lamont was in favor of the proposal, it wouldn't cost the Township any money and would provide a valuable connection between the Township and educational facilities. He noted in his experience, internships have proven to be fruitful but will involve a little more administrative time to make sure they are learning and to answer questions.

Trustee Hensler agreed and Treasurer Dubre also agreed as long as the program is not being proposed for the Treasurer's department.

Trustee Vallad clarified the two terms the Supervisor is proposing and commented he is not sure why someone would take a position that is unpaid but is willing to approve a program and see what happens.

Clerk Moreau expressed concern that the position(s) need to be represented accurately and be able to give someone real direction and experience. If this is the case, she would support the Supervisor's efforts.

Trustee Lamont added he would like to see job description(s) and administrative responsibilities outlined. He also asked Attorney Need to look at what the Township's liabilities would be and if there is any kind of agreement needed?

- * **Trustee Lamont moved to allow the Supervisor to embark on an internship program through the fall semester in conjunction with Oakland University students that would assume non-paid positions at the Township with the following conditions: 1) that job descriptions are outlined and complete before any internships are brought on board; and 2) that the Township Attorney checks the Township's liability as far as worker's compensation and general liability while working at the Township.**

Trustee Lamont amended the motion to include that the job descriptions be brought back to the Board at the July meeting. Treasurer Dubre supported the motion. Vote on the motion. Yes: Dubre, Hensler, Hopper, Lamont, Moreau, Trout, and Vallad; No: None; Absent: None. The motion carried by a 7 to 0 vote.

Trustee Vallad stated that by waiting and bringing the job description back to the Board, the Township could possibly miss the summer term opportunity and the Supervisor's proposal called for a re-evaluation based on two terms.

3. Tool & Die Recovery Zone – Carbide Form Master request

Supervisor Trout explained the State has a program for real and property tax exemption under the Michigan Renaissance Zone program which is specific to tool and die companies. Carbide Form Master, a Springfield Township based company, has requested to establish such a zone on their property. Supervisor Trout noted the Stoglin family, owners of Carbide Form, have operating their tool and die business since 1979.

Mr. Dan Hunter from Oakland County Economic Development began the presentation by giving the County's perspective. He noted their Economic Outlook Report is sobering in terms of job creation. He said it is important to have a healthy tool and die industry to maintain other diverse sectors such as car manufactures, health care, and the defense industry. The County is trying to do everything it can to retain these companies and is in support of Mr. Stoglin's request. He also noted another part of the program involves the tool and die company to join a collaborative of other tool and die companies around the State and to commit to working together so as to be able

to compete for larger projects. This program has been around for 3 to 4 years and will hopefully help job retention, company growth, and keep buildings occupied.

Mr. Stoglin, the owner, was present and commented they normally employ 12 to 15 tool laborers but in the last couple of years, business has decreased by about 50% due to the economy and companies going out of business. He said they have been able to hang in there but now only employ 6 full time employees who mostly live in the area. It was the County and State who contacted him about this program.

Ms. Margaret O'Riley, a consultant who works with the Michigan Manufacturers Association, spoke about collaboratives and how those who participate are able to strengthen their companies. She went on to give a brief history of the Michigan Renaissance Zone Program and how in 2004 it was amended to create Tool & Die Recovery Zones. Those that qualify and are supported by their community would receive real and property tax exemptions and become part of a tool and die collaborative. One of the benefits of the program is that companies can then take those tax dollars and reinvest them in the company and hopefully stay in the area and grow. She noted the program has been very successful to date. Currently there are 29 collaboratives in the State and 270 companies within those collaboratives. The collaborative Carbide Form would be joining has 17 companies primarily located in the metro Detroit area. Regarding school, ISD, community colleges, and library taxes - those would all be fully reimbursed. She asked the Board to consider passing a Resolution for Carbide Form Master to participate in the Tool & Die Recovery Zone Program (a sample Resolution was in the packet). She informed the Board that if they are supportive, the application to the State needs to be submitted by the end of September and is very lengthy. In answer to a question by Treasurer Dubre, Mrs. O'Riley stated the abatement would not take affect until December 31st.

It was noted taxes can be abated for up to 15 years and the tax relief will be phased out in 25% increments over the last 3 years (whether the abatement is 5 or 15 years).

Supervisor Trout reminded the Board a Resolution was passed a few years ago whereas the Township no longer supports Industrial Development Districts which gave companies tax abatements in specifically designated geographical areas.

Treasurer Dubre asked for clarification on how the County decides who qualifies; how it determines whether tax dollars are actually being put back into the company; and if other companies in Springfield qualify? She commented that Carbide Form Master has already received significant tax abatements for several years. She noted that looking at the Real Property Tax report that was provided, it appears the impact would be minimal but if other companies make a similar request, it could mean significant dollars especially in the declining economy. Treasurer Dubre was not comfortable making a decision tonight being they just got this information.

Mr. Hunter and Ms. O'Riley responded that companies have to meet certain North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes that are strictly related to the tool and die industry; the program is not monitored but companies do have to report to the State annually how much it has reinvested in machinery and equipment; and there may be 2 or 3 other companies in Springfield that qualify however the collaborative Carbide Form would be joining will not be accepting any more.

In response to how much paperwork will be involved to administer the program? Treasurer Dubre responded it will probably be extensive being this would be the first one the Township has done. She would like time to get with other communities to see what all is involved.

Trustee Hopper commented that once the Resolution is passed, it can not be recinded and was concerned that Carbide Form Master had 18 years of tax abatements and still had to cut back its number of employees.

Trustee Lamont asked what the impact has been in maintaining businesses, adding businesses, and adding jobs to the industry within collaboratives as opposed to non-collaboratives? Ms. O'Riley said based on a 2002 study on a collaborative model, there was a 30% increase in efficiency and the State has issued two reports which she can provide if the Board so desired..

Clerk Moreau expressed concern with what the company could do with the projected tax savings, would it be enough to save an employee or buy new equipment; and would like to find out more about how this would impact the Township. Mr. Stoglin responded he would be able to upgrade some equipment.

Trustee Vallad commented collaboratives are the only chance for small tool and die shops in the area - it's the small tool and die shops that keep the large factories going. Being part of a collaborative will allow them to bid on new and bigger jobs which is the only way they will be able to afford to update equipment and support new industries. He is in favor of assisting companies to get over the "hump" until the economy turns around but would not want an abatement to go much beyond 5 years.

Supervisor Trout concluded the Board is taking this request seriously and that it's the consensus of the Board to bring this back to the July meeting.

4. DTE Street Lighting cost estimates and discussion

Supervisor Trout commented he received resident concerns regarding the lack of lighting in the areas of Davisburg and Ormond roads and Dixie and Holly roads. In the packet he provided two cost estimates from DTE to install the lights and for annual operating costs.

There was discussion on were the money to install the lights would come from.

Clerk Moreau asked how intense the resident concerns were, she was concerned about flooding homes with excess light if the Board decides to go forward with this.

Supervisor Trout indicated that he received only a few complaints and suggested Board members drive these intersections at night and to bring this back for further discussion.

Trustee Vallad asked if there is a recent traffic study available? Supervisor Trout said he will look into that.

5. Accept Bid for Township Vehicle

Supervisor Trout noted the Township put together a bid package to possibly replace the 2000 GMC Sonoma. He received a bid for a GMC Canyon from Bell-Wasik in Caro and a bid for a Dodge Dakota from Al Deeby. He said his intent would be to transfer the old truck to the Parks & Recreation Department.

Trustee Lamont asked to abstain from the discussion being he is related to Bell-Wasik.

*** Supervisor Trout moved to excuse Trustee Lamont from discussion due to a personal conflict. Trustee Hensler supported the motion. Vote on the motion. Yes: Dubre, Hensler, Hopper, Moreau, Trout, and Vallad; No: None; Absent: None. The motion carried by a 6 to 0 vote.**

Treasurer Dubre asked if these trucks would be able to handle the snow plows the Township has. The response was no. The Board then discussed purchasing a full size pick-up.

Trustee Hopper agreed a full size truck would be more useful and wouldn't be that much more expensive. He noted there are 3 dealerships in the Township that sell full size trucks.

Clerk Moreau inquired about the condition of the Sonoma truck and the need to replace the vehicle at this time. Mike Forst, Property Manager indicated the truck is in "fair" condition. Suited for park use but not highway travel.

Trustee Vallad suggested checking with the County on their purchase program? Supervisor Trout said he will do that and bring this item back.

6. Accept Bid for demolition and removal of lumberyard structures

Supervisor Trout referred the bids and specifications in the packet. Mike Forstmet with 3 local prospective bidders at the site last Friday. He noted the bids ranged from approximately \$12,000 to \$25,000. He also noted the Planning Commission toured the site and the general consensus

was that all the buildings should be removed. Supervisor Trout also noted the foundations of two of the structures were sound and the Board needed to consider whether to leave those or to also have them removed. It was his recommendation to remove all the buildings, the foundations of buildings 1 and 2, the additional slabs (the foundations of building 3 and the car wash are in good condition and could remain).

Trustee Lamont, as a Planning Commission member, said the Planning Commission did consider saving one of the buildings but the cost to save it and what it could be used for or if it could generate any revenue for the Township was a concern. He agreed everything should be removed and to start with a clean slate.

Trustee Hensler was surprised at the price variances in the bids. It was her opinion to get rid of everything including the two good concrete pads so as to be able to start from scratch. If the pads are left and the Township eventually decides to remove them, it would cost more to remove them at that time.

Trustee Hopper concurred, the foundations may be good now but will they be after being exposed to a few winters? He doesn't believe anything will be done at the site for a while.

Treasurer Dubre also concurred.

Clerk Moreau was supportive of everything being removed.

It was Trustee Vallad's opinion removing the car wash would assist in any future planning; it would save a couple thousand dollars to leave it there.

Trustee Hopper commented if the car wash is left, doors would have to put on it, the electric turned back on, the well would have to be working, and whatever else. He believed it would be less to get rid of it.

- * **Clerk Moreau moved to authorize the Supervisor to move forward with the demolition of the 4 (four) buildings and all foundations contained in the information presented in the diagram and award the bid to Roger's Excavating to carry out and complete the work as outlined with a cost not to exceed \$12,000.00.**

Clerk Moreau amended the motion to include: per bid specifications. Trustee Hensler supported the motion. Vote on the motion. Yes: Dubre, Hensler, Hopper, Lamont, Moreau, Trout, and Vallad; No: None; Absent: None. The motion carried by a 7 to 0 vote.

7. Authorize Township Attorney to retain appraiser for Tax Appeal

Supervisor Trout referred to the memo from Attorney Need dated June 7, 2010.

Attorney Need explained the Township needs to defend a tax appeal brought by Kroger as outlined in his memo. The taxable value difference is approximately \$1.2 which is a significant appeal. To be successful either in negotiating a settlement or having to take it to court, an appraiser will be needed as an expert witness. He is recommending Mr. Fuller who is also handling an appeal in White Lake Township brought on by Kroger, this could mean a cost savings for the Township. Attorney Need has worked with Mr. Fuller for a few years and he has done several appraisals for White Lake and is well regarded by the tax tribunal. He is requesting the Board authorize him to go forward. He noted the Township has a better chance with its appeal over other communities because it is a fairly new store.

Trustee Hopper asked if Attorney Need is looking for authorization for both phases of the process? Attorney Need responded, yes. He noted Kroger is going through a similar two phase process and hopefully once both parties have their numbers, a resolution can be considered and save the cost of a full appraisal and hearing. He would like authorization for both, just in case, so as not to incur any possible time delays.

Treasurer Dubre commented she was not comfortable authorizing both phases at this time and expects the Township will have to pay back money for 2008, 2009, and 2010 will probably follow. She was concerned the expense to contract an appraiser was not budgeted for. The Board then discussed where the money would be taken from. Trustee Vallad suggested this be further discussed at the next Budget and Finance Committee meeting.

It was Trustee Hensler's opinion the Township needs to fight this with full force because it could end up being quite costly.

- * **Trustee Hopper moved to authorize the Township Attorney to retain an appraiser for the tax appeal as an expert witness as outlined in his memo dated June 7, 2010; cost not to exceed \$8,000.00. Trustee Lamont supported the motion. Vote on the motion. Yes: Dubre, Hensler, Hopper, Lamont, Moreau, Trout, and Vallad; No: None; Absent: None. The motion carried by a 7 to 0 vote.**

8. Budget planning session discussion (added)

Supervisor Trout referred to the Budget and Finance Committee's report in the packet. He agreed with Trustee Vallad the Board needs to get a head start on a lot of the planning and decisions that need to be made for upcoming budgets.

Trustee Vallad added there are a lot of things that have been started but not defined as to how they are going to be funded. He has concerns with not necessarily next year but for 2012 with depleting funds because of lost tax revenues. He noted they have the audit report that can provide historical information that will be useful for budget planning. There is a lot of uncertainty with what is going to happen with revenue sharing from the State. He believes they have enough information to have a workshop and to get the full Board's input. He suggested the Budget and Finance Committee put together a single packet of the financial information for the workshop.

The Board agreed to meet on Monday, July 12th at 6:00 pm for a budget workshop.
